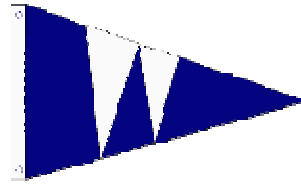

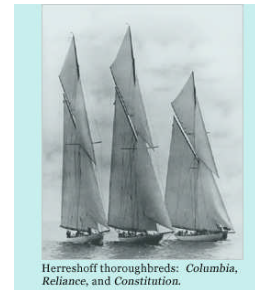

Karen is determined to face life's daily challenges and to accomplish her goal to compete at the top level of sail racing. Her goal is to be the first female skipper to represent the U.S.A. and win the Gold in the 2008 Paralympics games in sailing.

She has been a winner of the Shake A Leg Regatta in Miami and also the C.R.A.B. Cup on the Chesapeake Bay. Karen won the 2007 Disabled World Championship and was a team member of the SKUD 18 disabled sailing team. She not only won the Best Female Sailor Award in Biscayne Bay, but has sailed the J-22 World Championships, Key West Race Week and the Miami Race Week in a J-24.

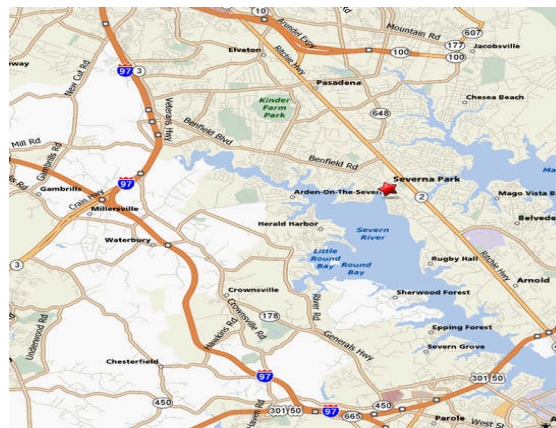

Miranda started sailing when she was 5 years old on the River Seine, south of Paris. At the age of 9 she was crewing for her father in his International 14 and then sailed Lasers throughout school holidays in Puerto Rico. Educated in England, she graduated from Cambridge University before going to work in Japan in advertising, and later in Sydney and Paris.

Miranda has been sailing professionally for 11 years, mainly in offshore racing, and has competed in solo, double-handed and fully-crewed races, including the Route du Rhum, the Transat Jacques Vabre, and the Volvo Ocean Race.

During May 2008 Miranda completed The Artemis Transat Race crossing from Plymouth, England to Boston, U.S.A in 18 days, 19 hours, 34 seconds. This solo competition on a Class 40 monohull provides interesting stories of action on the high seas.

Directions to Severn School



From Annapolis/South

Take Route 50 East across the Severn River Bridge. Exit onto Route 2 North toward Baltimore (first exit after bridge). Follow Route 2 North to the McKinsey Road intersection (5th traffic light). Turn left onto McKinsey and follow it through one traffic light until you come to the stop sign at the intersection of McKinsey and Evergreen Road. The main entrance for Severn School is directly in front of you. Proceed across Evergreen onto Maple Avenue.

From Baltimore/North

Take Route 695 West toward Glen Burnie. Exit onto Route 10 South toward Severna Park. Follow Route 10 South until it ends at a traffic light. Turn left onto Route 2 South. Follow Route 2 South to Baltimore & Annapolis Boulevard (4th traffic light). Veer right onto Baltimore & Annapolis Blvd. and continue to the stop sign at Riggs Road. Turn right onto Riggs Road and proceed one block to the stop sign at Evergreen Road. The main entrance for Severn School is directly in front of you. Proceed across Evergreen onto Maple Avenue.
