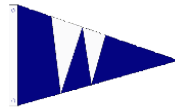

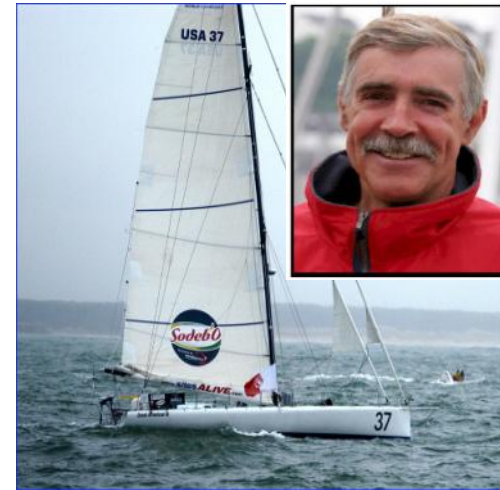

**Rich Wilson
 Solo Sailor
 2008-2009 Vendee Globe**

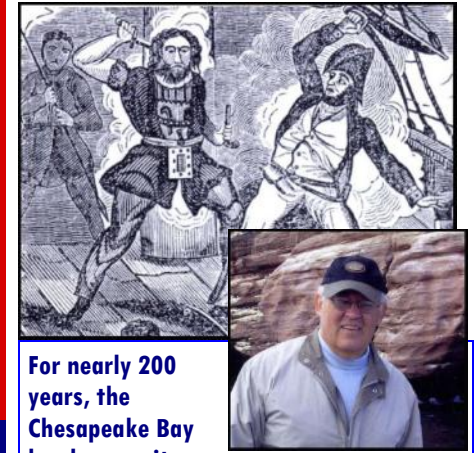


Rich Wilson finished 9th in the Vendee Globe 2008-9, a solo, non-stop, sailing race around the world. He was the only American, the only asthmatic, and the oldest skipper (58) in the fleet. Of 30 starters, only 11 finished. Sailing 28,790 miles in 121 days, Wilson endured broken ribs, a facial gash, compressed vertebrae, hurricane force gales, an ascent up the 90' mast, crushing fatigue, fear, and gear breakage in braving the course via the Atlantic, Indian and Pacific Oceans, Cape of Good Hope and Cape Horn, in his 60' monohull *Great American III*.

The primary purpose of the voyage was K12 education. Founder of sitesALIVE!, Rich connected his voyage to 250,000 students and 7 million readers by publication of a 15 part weekly series written aboard ship.

For nearly 200 years, the Chesapeake Bay has borne witness to a dazzling array of swashbuckling pirates, picaroons, and sea rovers. Often times these rogue sailors were pitted against the feckless representatives of outposts of colonial and later American governmental authority.

From 1608 to present day, its waters, shoals and bottoms have served the final resting place to nearly 10,000 vessels, lost in wars, maritime disasters, and seaborne tragedies without precedent on the Atlantic Seaboard.

Historian, marine archeologists, author of 15 books, Donald Shomette will present an illustrated lecture of the history of pirates, sea battles and buccaneering with tales of maritime loss, heroism and redemption in the Chesapeake Tidewater.

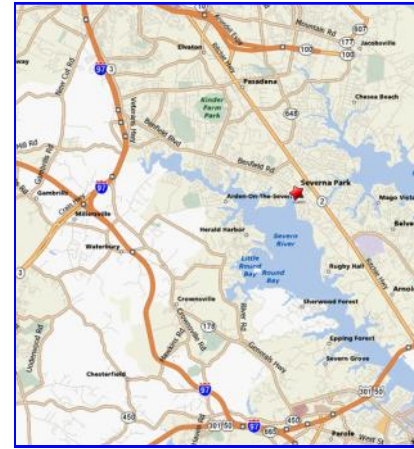

Sailing Writer, Adventurer
Around the Americas Voyage**



On Memorial Day weekend, 2009, a 64-foot sailboat called Ocean Watch set sail from Seattle on an expedition called Around the Americas. The voyage's mission was to draw attention to the health of our oceans. The voyage would cast North and South America as a singular island surrounded by a common sea.

A little over a year later, after 382 days and a journey of over 27,000 nautical miles, Ocean Watch returned to Seattle following a passage that circled the continents via the once-impassable Northwest Passage and Cape Horn. Sailing writer Herb McCormick was one of four sailors to complete the entire voyage -- a rotating cast of scientists and teachers joined the boat for individual legs -- and his lecture and slide show will detail the fascinating and educational adventure Around the Americas.

Directions to Severn School



From Annapolis/South
Take Route 50 East across the Severn River Bridge. Exit onto Route 2 North toward Baltimore (first exit after bridge). Follow Route 2 North to the McKinsey Road intersection (5th traffic light). Turn left onto McKinsey and follow it through one traffic light until you come to the stop sign at the intersection of McKinsey and Evergreen Road. The main entrance for Severn School is directly in front of you. Proceed across Evergreen onto Maple Avenue.

From Baltimore/North
Take Route 695 West toward Glen Burnie. Exit onto Route 10 South toward Severna Park. Follow Route 10 South until it ends at a traffic light. Turn left onto Route 2 South. Follow Route 2 South to Baltimore & Annapolis Boulevard (4th traffic light). Veer right onto Baltimore & Annapolis Blvd. and continue to the stop sign at Riggs Road. Turn right onto Riggs Road and proceed one block to the stop sign at Evergreen Road. The main entrance for Severn School is directly in front of you. Proceed
